MOVCAC – Roane County Excess Death Analysis

Based on population numbers provided by <u>West Virginia Demographics</u>, Roane County ranks thirty-ninth in the state with 13,743 total residents. MOVCAC has performed numerous detailed analyses on Wood County excess death. Via that analysis, we confirmed that 2021 saw the highest levels of death experienced in recent history. Based on that analysis and the publication of the 2021 vital statistics by the WV DHHR, we are finally able to provide an analysis of this excess death phenomenon for each county in West Virginia.

Roane County is only one of two counties in West Virginia (Tyler County is the other) where the record for total death was NOT set in either 2020 or 2021. Roane County set its total death record in 2018. Roane County no doubt fared better than the vast majority of counties in our state:

Note – While each of the other years in the tables above are compared to the prior year, 2021 is compared to the pre-pandemic year of 2019. It makes no sense to compare 2021 to an already pandemic-effected elevated death total in 2020.

There are no age-ranged tables to show. Roane County appears to have navigated the pandemic successfully and avoided anomalous excess death.

The age-ranged table that follows was created by compiling each year's age-ranged data provided on the "Age at Death by County of Residence" table in the appendix section of each year's <u>Vital Statistics Report published by DHHR from 2011 to 2020</u>. The 2021 report no longer contains these detailed schedules. We contacted the DHHR for the 2021 details and were provided a spreadsheet containing the county level detail.

Age Ranges of Concern

The following age-ranged table shows the most alarming growth for Roane County.

(*)Note – For the table below, the two highest years in regards to total death are identified by the bold boxes. The percent change column is comparing totals for each year to the prior year for years 2011 through 2020. For the 2021 percent change calculation, the next highest death total is identified and used as the comparison year.

The age-range explanation is left above even though Roane County has no anomalous data to report. It is important for Roane County residents to understand how fortunate they are. The

rest of the state did not perform anywhere close. Perhaps Roane County should be studied to understand how their leadership created more favorable outcomes?
