Below is a sample script that can be used when calling/emailing a representative:

Introduce yourself and where you live. I am calling (or emailing) regarding the Deep Rock Solutions American Growers #4 Class II injection well proposed for Warren Township, Washington County, Ohio. I strongly oppose the permitting of another Class II injection well in Washington County! DeepRock wants to receive millions of gallons more of toxic radioactive waste that is dangerous to our communities. I stand with the Warren Water Board and Warren Township Trustees in their requests of Eric Vendel, Chief of ODNR Oil and Gas Division to meet with them in order to get our questions answered and concerns heard. This injection well is part of their plan to accept waste by-rail and by river barge to store in their facility tanks on the Ohio River - it can be as much as 2,200,000 gallons of toxic, radioactive waste. Washington County already has 17 Class II Wells—more than any other county in Ohio. The water for our communities is in jeopardy and the community deserves to be heard.
